## **INVESTMENT**

In 2020, the minerals sector invested \$12 billion in new capital construction and in machinery and equipment, accounting for 5% of total non-residential capital investment in Canada.

In 2019, publicly traded Canadian-based companies had total mining and exploration assets of \$263 billion. About two-thirds (\$178 billion) were located abroad.

## PRODUCTION

In 2020, mineral production totalled \$44 billion, Canada produces some 60 minerals and metals at about 200 mines and 6,500 sand and gravel pits and stone quarries.

## INDIGENOUS PARTICIPATION

The minerals industry is an important employer of Indigenous peoples, providing jobs to over 16,500 individuals. Indigenous people account for 12% of mining's labour force, amongst the highest representation by industry.
